POTENTIAL HEALTH EFFECTS

EYES: This substance is slightly irritating to the eyes. Eye contact may include discomfort, tearing redness, swelling, and blurred vision. See Toxicologilation action, section 11.

SKIN: This substance is a severe skin irritant so contact with the skin could cause prolonged (weel injury to the affected area. The degree of injury will pend on the amount of material that gets on the skin and the speed and thoroughness of the first aichtment. Irritation may include redness, swelling and possibly blistering. If absorbed through the skin, this substance is considered practically non-to to internal organs. See section 11.

INGESTION: This substance is slightly toxic to internal organs if swallowed. The degree of injury will depend on the amount absorbed from the grecause of the low viscosity of this substance, it ca directly enter the lungs if it is swallowed (this is called aspinn). This can occur during the act of swallowing or when vomiting the substance. Once in the lungs, the substance is very difficult to remove and can cause severe injury to the lungs and death.

INHALATIONIf inhaled, this substance is considered practically non-toxic to internal organs.

COMMENTS HEALTH: This product active ingredient is a carbamate and considered to be a reversible cholinesterase inhibitor. Signs and any inptoms may appear within 1-2 hours following overexposure and may include, but may not be limited to, headache, constriction of this pfithe eye, blurred vision, excessive salivation or nasal discharge, profuse sweating, abdominal cramps, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Convulsions are rarely seen arbamate poisoning. In untreated severe poisoning, respiratory depression or cardiacrest may be fatal.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

EYES: If in eyes, immediately flush with plenty of water. Get medical attention if irritation persist

SKIN: If on skin, remove contaminated clothing, wash skin with plenty of soap and water. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse. If irritation persistee a doctor.
